

BUILDING FUND

The Building Fund provides for necessary repairs and maintenance of the buildings in our parish. The estimated cost of these two repairs is **\$68,000.**

The fund currently has a balance of **\$12,971.22.**

ALL SAINTS SOLEMNITY


ROSARY AT MOUNT ST. MARY CEMETERY

As part of our Bicentennial celebration and in honor of the Solemnity of All Saints, we will be making a visit to the grave of Fr. Bernard Donnelly, the founder of the St. Mary's as a parish. We will leave St. Mary's at **9:00am on Wednesday, November 1st**. We will pray a Rosary while processing through the cemetery, ending at Fr. Donnelly's grave and concluding with a short prayer service in Thanksgiving and also for all who have served our parish over the years.

BICENTENNIAL PAGEANT

The day after being ordained a priest, Fr. Donnelly received his much anticipated assignment: to establish the Holy Cross Mission into a parish (what was named St. Mary's). Other records show that at the time, it was a parish of 18,000 square miles.

PASTOR'S CORNER

The Truly UNIVERSAL Church

Some have said that the most important work that the Church does on earth is to pray for the dead, all those who have gone before us in the hope of the resurrection of Christ. As we enter what has traditionally been known as the Triduum of Hallowtide, we are drawn to our understanding of the dead and the relationship that the Church on earth (militant) shares with the church in heaven (Triumphant) and church in purgatory (suffering). In other words, these are days when we see the revelation of the fullness of the Universal Church.

In a time when our secular culture is getting further and further away from any Christian influence, it is becoming more important to be attentive to your funeral home of choice. This is not simply a matter of choosing a company that is friendlier than another, offers better deals, or even the one that your family has always used. Rather, the understanding of our faith and what Christ has taught us about both this life and the next, has a profound impact on how we treat the dead and grieving families. With every funeral, the importance of choosing a Catholic funeral home is reinforced for me more and more. In our area, this is either Muehlebach or Passantino's. Time and time again I have seen how either corporate, or non-Catholic ownership of the funeral has made a significant affect on how they approach the time right after death and the family.

This is also the time to remind ourselves of the importance of the burying of the body. While the Church has acknowledged that cremation is permissible when it is necessary, the revelation of the Resurrection of the Body, and unity of the body and spirit, informs us that cremation is not to be done as a choice, or out of convenience (expense alone would be considered a choice and not a necessity).

The time of our passing is a privileged and sanctified time. There are many reasons why burying of the dead, and praying for them has long been recognized as both a spiritual and corporal work of mercy. There are unique prayers the Church offers from the time of death until the beginning of the funeral Mass. We begin the funeral itself with the priest receiving the body of the deceased at the entrance of the church and the casket is clothed with the white pall as sign of the baptismal garment, so that as we accompany them and escort them before the altar on earth, they are dressed in the clothes they received at baptism. And then after being escorted to the foot of the holy altar on earth, they rest, facing the altar. It is as though the Church on earth knows that we have brought them here to as close to God as we can in this life. Between the altar here and the Altar in heaven, there is a threshold that we cannot cross. But we stand with them and pray for them on this side, offering both the grief of our tears and the testimony of our prayers, that they may rise, like the sweet aroma of incense to our Heavenly Father.

There is space between the time of death and entry to Heaven (for the faithful) and we seek to be present with them in the liturgy, as the Church and friendship through prayer. We pray for them in purgatory and remain united with the Saints who enjoy the beatific union.
