

THANKSGIVING DINNER


NOVEMBER 18TH



PASTOR'S CORNER

Thirty Something

Everyone who is old enough to know, know's that things change when you hit your 30s. While it may not be time to get ready for the end (we aren't over the hill yet), once our count hits that thirty mark, we know that changes aren't too far away. It's the same for the church. Once we start hearing the 30th and 31st week of Ordinary Time, we know that Advent, the start of a new Liturgical and Spiritual year, is getting close. It's time to start planning and getting ready for Advent.

One of the first and most important things that we can do for Advent is to recall that it is a penitential season and time of removing all of the distractions, obstacles and things that hinder us from seeing God's presence in our lives. This is a time to actively seek out our sins and hone our examinations, not so that I can be more aware of my guilt, but because sins distract and cloud our vision from recognizing the presence of God; they keep us from accepting Him more fully into our life. This is also a very opportune time to make a general confession, to look back over the course of our life and identify (confess) those sins from our past that we can see still have a lasting affect on us, our spiritual life and relationships with others.

Spiritual Reading: Be deliberate in choosing a book to read for Advent. It may be something written explicitly for the season of Advent, one that you have been considering reading for a long time, or anything else that will help you in learning about the faith and advancing in the Spiritual Life. Set a daily goal for reading, 5-20 minutes is good for most (you can always read more).

Particular Examination: Set a particular examine to focus on throughout Advent. This is one specific area that you would like to be attentive to. It could be something like, not snacking between meals; needing to be the center of attention; gossiping about others.

Prayer: During Lent, our prayer is focused on sorrow for our sins and joining with the suffering of Christ, Advent is a season of quiet prayer. And some extra time each day for a form of quiet prayer. This is a particularly good season for time in Adoration, or for sitting in front of holy images: icons or religious art.

Fasting and Abstinence: Advent is a time for fasting and abstinence, and not just to make room for more Christmas feasting and goodies. It is a less intense fast than Lent, but in this season, it's good to identify things that we crave and desire most. It's helpful to identify one thing that you abstain from for the entire season of Advent and something that you abstain from for one day each week. I may give up desserts for all of Advent and give-up coffee one day each week.

Charity: Be intentional about making acts of charity throughout Advent. Plan one thing that is a 'most significant' act of charity and other things that you would do at least once each week.

Parish Life: Mark your calendars for special events in the parish. Mondays at 6pm, beginning **Nov. 27th** we will have our Advent series on The Way of Discernment, specific practices on how to recognize the presence and voice of God; Parish Day of Reflection on **Dec. 9th**; Lessons and Carols and auction will be on **Dec. 15th** at 6pm.
