
LESSONS & CAROLS

LESSONS & CAROLS SERVICE AND SILENT AUCTION

St. Mary's annual *Lessons and Carols* service is on **Friday Dec. 15th @ 6:00pm.** Following the service, we will have hors d'oerves and silent auction. This year's auction will feature a limited edition of the main Marian Mural in the church, reproduced on wood. No more than 15 of these images will be produced. We will also feature some religious statues from St. Ann's, dinner prepared and served by Fr. Kendall, a Tandem Bike and several baskets from parish groups.

YOUTH CATECHESIS

Our level one atrium students have been learning how to make a silence, how to walk with quiet feet, and how to work with controlled movement. They have learned how to play "the quiet game", how to properly roll and unroll a work mat, and how to sing several of our atrium songs. The purpose of these activities is to create a reverent and quiet work environment that enables them to pray through an inner attitude of joy, which is their natural form of prayer. They have also learned how to set and reset their prayer table, been introduced to the nomenclature for objects used on the altar, and about our liturgical colors.

MORNING PRAYER The Prayer of the Church

During Sundays of Advent, we will pray Morning Prayer (Lauds) prior to the the 11am Mass, beginning at 10:30am. Prayer aids will be on the table near the main entrance of the church and will provide everything you need.



ADVENT REFLECTIONS ROOTED

This Advent daily reflection series begins on December 3rd. It guides Catholics through a daily Advent reflection using the Jesse Tree model traditionally practiced by families. Each seven-minute episode introduces the ancestors of Jesus Christ, shares a Scripture passage, and offers an engaging, practical reflection.

Hosted by Dr. Scott Hefelfinger, Rooted helps viewers apply the passage and related teachings to each day of Advent, guided by the Church's teaching.

Day of Reflection on Eastern Catholic Theology of the Blessed Virgin Mary Dec. 9th 8am - 1pm

Theotokos (God Bearer) is the most common used title of the BVM in many Eastern Rites of the church. Dcn. John from St. Luke's Byzantine Catholic Church will share with us many of the Eastern theologies and devotions to Mary.

Week 2 Recognizing the Divine: Rules for how to recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit

In order to discern one needs to spend time in spiritual discourse and the prayer of quiet.

We have all heard many ways and methods of discerning a major decision: lists of pros/cons, your gifts or your goals; tests to determine personality, interests and skills; simply trust your gut. Diadochus tells us, rather, that the first step is to develop friendship with God, that is get to know Him, and you will better understand what He desires and wills for you.

Pastor's Corner

Containing all Sweetness

Have you ever thought of Advent as being a particularly Eucharistic season? Yes, all seasons, and even every day, from Ordinary Time to Easter and post-Pentecost, is a Eucharistic time. We are a Eucharistic people just as we can equally say that we are a people of the Resurrection and every day is an experience of the Resurrection, but at the same time, recognize that Easter is the primary season of the Resurrection and Christmas is the season of the Incarnation. Advent and Lent are the seasons of the Eucharist.

In Lent, we experience the chalice. It is a season and time of joining in the sufferings of Christ, and with our brothers and sisters, like the Apostles James and John who drank from the same chalice of our Lord. Advent, on the other hand and in completion of the Mystery, calls our mind toward the body and bread. In a first and very simple, profound way, we may recall the incarnation that is to come and revealed on Christmas morning. Just as the Word became flesh in the birth of Christ, bread becomes His flesh in the Holy Eucharist. In Advent, we are drawn into reaping the harvest of God becoming man.

Psalm 126, which is the Psalm for Mass on the 2nd Sunday Advent in Year C also recalls this relationship between the the chalice (or wine) and the bread.

Those who sow in tears, will reap with cries of joy. Those who go forth weeping, carrying sacks of seed; will return with cries of joy, carrying their sheaves.

In the prophets and many other places, scripture describes for us the difference and union of wine and bread in experiencing the fullness of joy and salvation. The bread, representing food, nourishment, harvest, abundance and the gifts of blessings of the Lord.

In Advent our attention is focused on the life giving harvest and fulfillment of promises that had been long announced and anticipated with the coming of the Messiah. We recall all of those promises that are fulfilled through Him and the fulfillment of Hope.

We strip away extraneous things, like the false ideas of what a Messiah was supposed to be: he was not born a prince of the kingdom, nor wealthy, nor to the adulation of crowds, but in the simplicity of a manger, to a virgin and a helpless child—the Word made Flesh.

Today, His body comes to us in a similar way: the simplicity of bread, the smallness of a wafer, the most humble of foods, yet containing all sweetness and all nourishment within it; taking us from despair to hope, reminding us of the promises fulfilled and the Son being poured into flesh.
