

# PASTOR'S CORNER

### A Living Church

We would not expect an apple, while still on the tree to become a kumquat, or a goat to become a lion. Yet none would argue against these things being alive and living. To be living does not mean that one changes into something else, but quite the contrary, it becomes what it already is. The apple, being born from a budding flower, so long as it remains alive it will grow into an apple, bearing its own seeds that, being alive, become tress that produce apples. Along the way it may face disease insects and other creatures, things that threaten its life. All living things face these threats. This is not part of being alive, but is part of living in a fallen world, a world that has sin and has introduced death into the world.

To be living means that one grows into its fullness. So long that is alive, the apple and its seeds become become fruit bearing trees.

The Church is a Living Church. While it grows toward becoming its fullness, it does not change into something else. In this world, it also faces the threat of disease and things that would destroy it.

The recent document from the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, *Fiducia Supplicans*, is a sign of this Living Church, that is at the same time, not healthy. First and foremost, it does not represent a change in the teaching or theology of the Church. Doctrine, which has been revealed by Christ, cannot change. It can become better and more fully understood, but it cannot change into something different. It even states very clearly that it does not change the Church's understanding of marriage, and gives no formal approval for irregular situations (unions). At the same time, we may recall that Dan Brown's Divinci Code also states clearly in the first pages that it is a work of fiction and not intended to portray reality. And yet, how many people have taken hold of its conspiracy theories.

It remains fair to say, and important to acknowledge that *Fiducia Supplicans* does represent an attack against the life-giving teachings of the Church on marriage and family. People, including some priests and bishops, to misrepresent what has been revealed to be true. I believe that it comes from a sickness in the Church and if not addressed and treated as such, will go the way of all serious illnesses. This is not something to panic over, but neither is it something to ignore.

Unlike physically life-threatening viruses and conditions, we have the treatment. The Messiah came to heal and in His life showed both His Power and His Love. We are in the season of giving thanks for His birth. And so there is nothing to fear. We are truly alive, as He is Alive; as He fell to the ground as a grain of wheat, He gave birth and rise to His Church; as He who is unchanging is, we remain Living.
