



TOWN IS A WITNESS TO THE RESURRECTION

On April 21, 2019, the town of Katuwapitiya, in Sri Lanka, saw a joyful Easter Sunday turn into a scene of unimaginable horror. An explosion completely destroyed the Church of St. Sebastian, claiming the lives of 115 people, including 27 children. This tragedy was one of eight coordinated attacks carried out by seven terrorists in different parts of the country, which resulted in the deaths of 264 people and left more than 500 wounded.

YOUTH CATECHESIS

EIGHT THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE

On March 14th, we had a wonderful celebration as our confirmands received the Sacrament of Confirmation at St. Mark's Parish, with Bishop Johnston conferring the Sacrament and Father Ketterlin concelebrating.

We recently focused on and completed the Didache Confirmation Preparation workbook. This workbook was designed for early teenage students to assist them in prayer, discernment, and a deeper conversion of faith. It includes key references from Sacred Scripture and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, along with practical exercises, activities, study questions, and ideas for reflection and discussion.

We are concluding the year by reading the book "The Imitation of Christ," a devotional book offering spiritual guidance and insights into living a life of humility, prayer, and the importance of following Christ's example.

KITCHEN REMODEL

Remodeling of the main kitchen in Fitzgerald Hall begins this week. PASTOR'S CORNER

Living Flame of Love

"Oh, living flame of love
That tenderly woundest my soul in its deepest centre,
Since thou art no longer oppressive, perfect me now if it be thy will,
Break the web of this sweet encounter."

--St. John of the Cross--

Before Jesus left the twelve, our Lord told them that He will send the Holy Spirit, whom the world cannot accept, because the world neither knows, nor is able to see Him. It may seem like an odd thing to think that the world will not accept the Holy Spirit, but we also remember that the world did not accept the Son of God, and as He said to the pharisees, if you knew me, you would know my Father; and that if we knew Him, we would love Him. It is no accident that Christ is using the same language to describe the coming Holy Spirit, the Advocate, as Himself, but there is more to these words than simply a revelation of their union in the Holy Trinity. The world, that is, the things that are born of the world and attached to the world; those things that have fallen and been separated from Heaven. They do not know God because it is inherently impossible for one to know Him and deny Him. They cannot stand Him, because they have denied Him.

When Christ speaks of the world, He speaks of those who have chosen the world over God. If one has chosen the things of this world over God, then it cannot stand the presence of God. Have you ever been forced to stand in the same room with someone whom you despised or with whom you were very angry. It quickly becomes untenable and even intolerable. This is a simple truth that Jesus is describing for us. And can you imagine if this enemy, one whom you denied and had set yourself against was infinitely more powerful than you and the source of all life? It is by its very nature, that evil can not stand in the presence of God and will try to flee. But those who know God and see Him will come to him and be strengthened by that same fire which the things of the world cannot stand.

This is the Living Flame of Love that John of the Cross describes. He writes of the soul's encounter with the Holy Spirit. He is the Living Flame, the flame that gives life and can only give life. He writes of an intimate and loving encounter with the soul "in its deepest center." At the same time, it wounds us. The Spirit wounds those parts which have not yet been perfected, which are still attached to the world. It is the skilled and loving Healer who seeks to remove places of illness that prevent us from acting in virtue in every moment, or cause us to seek our pride. The Spirit desires to set us free from the worries and cares of this world so that our eyes always see the presence of God. It is purifying and perfecting.
